Building communities that strengthen, support, restore, and empower female veterans as they transition to civilian life.



Military Women of Valor aims to create a restorative home for female veterans and their children.

The National Alliance to End Homelessness (NAEH) estimated that 38% of all homeless individuals living in shelters are women. Women comprise the fastest-growing segment of the homeless Veteran population. From 2016 to 2017, the number of homeless female Vets increased by 7% compared to 1% for their male counterparts.

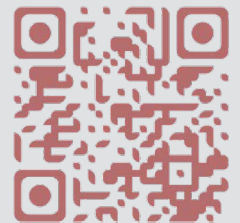
WHAT WE WILL DO
